Term 1 studies Jesus' life from Luke's Gospel, continually asking, 'Who is Jesus?' as his teaching and healing point to the revelation that he is the fulfilment of all God's promises. *Term 2* looks at the promises made to Abraham and shows how these promises were ultimately given to all people through Jesus.

Term 3 looks at the promises given to Moses and Joshua and shows how they are fulfilled in Jesus and are for all people at all time. *Term 4* looks at the Christian gospel through Romans showing that we cannot earn God's favour, rather it is a gift given freely through faith in Jesus, God's risen Son.



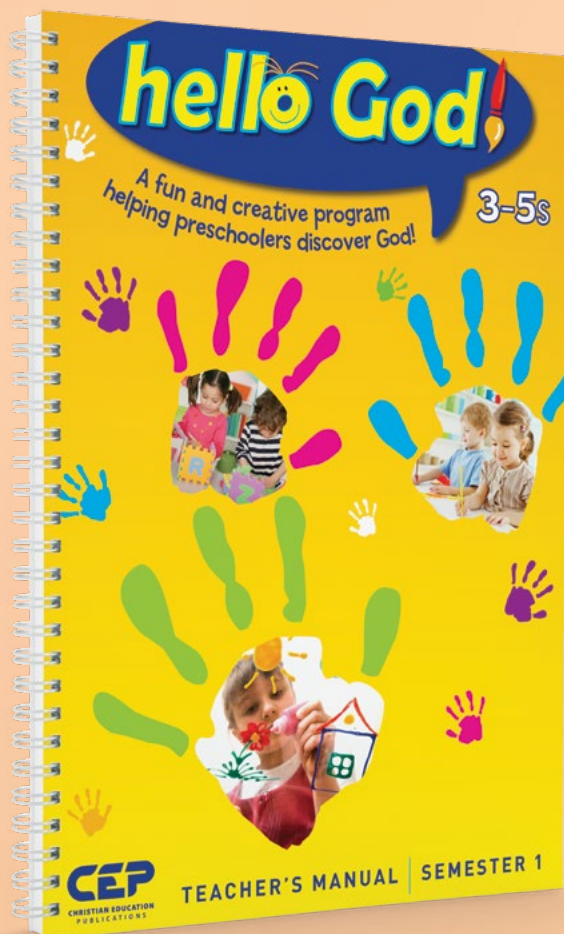

Hello God! introduces preschool children aged 3–5 to the Christian faith. It uses both Old and New Testament passages to explore themes such as God's character, his world and promises, and what it means to trust him.

Semester 1 focuses on the themes of 'Who is God? Who is Jesus?' and 'God and his world'.

Semester 2 examines the themes of 'Trusting God and living for him' and 'God keeps his promises'.
